

## **Company Safety Policy**

They are also to ensure that all operations are performed with the utmost regard for the health and safety of all employees, contractors, sub contractors, suppliers, and visitors.

Employees are responsible for full cooperation in all aspects of the health and safety program. They are also required to understand and comply with all legislative, company, industry, and contractor standards, to take every reasonable precaution to protect the health and safety of then self and their coworkers, and to report all unsafe acts or conditions they identify immediately.
